#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2017 marked our 9th year in Education allowing our school to continue to build and consolidate on the success, academic and personal growth for each and every student at Laurimar Primary School. Our goal to provide rich educational achievement and opportunities for each child was a major focus. The year was highlighted by the multitude of educational opportunities provided to our highly engaged students. Teaching and learning with a focus on our strong literacy and numeracy programs continued to be a feature, Allowing the time and space for our teachers to deliver high quality content around CAFÉ Reading Strategies, our VOICES Writing program which was introduced as a result of targeted and specific professional development initiatives. The Big Ideas In Mathematics in our Numeracy Program continued to develop knowledge, consistency and understanding across the school

We have continued to deliver and enhance engaging educational programs that respond to the directions of the Department of Education and Training (DET) under the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes. New Initiatives under the Education State such as the Literacy and Numeracy strategy have been implemented where our school's focus on Building Practice Excellence and Empowering Students to Build School Pride were made a priority. In 2017, the first year of our 4-year Strategic Plan, we also drew upon strategies that foster connectedness between our school and each family with a strong emphasis on building relationships between staff, students and families.

As a school we continued to build upon our strong 'Learning Architecture' and continue to reflect and evaluate its effectiveness in the classroom. Through all learning programs, the 10 hours of literacy (RAW Program and VOICES writing) and 5 hours of numeracy each week build proficiency across these areas. Throughout the 2017 school year, we aimed to once again embed our stance in the Doreen and wider community as a Dynamic Educational Institution that creates a strong academic language when it comes to our learning and provide excellence in Primary Education to ALL students and families.

Our school curriculum and opportunities provided through the year has been diverse and extensive. Our strong teaching and learning leader culture allowed for 5 lead teachers (teaching and learning leaders) to coach, model, reflect, inspire and support teachers in being able to focus on their classroom practice and delivering consistency for students. To complement effective teaching, we were also able to offer our strong Clubs program initiative, Energy Breakthough Program in Maryborough in the Human Powered Vehicle Event, Whole School Production over 3 nights, Diverse Arts program, Physical and Sport Education program, Chinese Mandarin program encompassing our China Exchange Trip and a focussed and strong Social and Emotional Learning program. All programs and teacher delivery within them aim to inspire through a multitude of engaging activities and strategies. In 2017, we certainly were able to cater for and provide the maximum learning opportunities and broad range of extra-curricular activities available for all our students.

#### Our HIGHLIGHTS and ACHIEVEMENTS for 2017 School Year

The following list represents some of the fulfilling achievements and opportunities for students and staff that come to mind when we look back on the success of the 2017 school year at Laurimar Primary School. We can recall many of the engaging activities provided by our entire staff throughout the school during our 9th year of education.

#### Years leading up to the 2017 school year

Construction of the new school commenced back in 2008, when the Minster of Education, Bronwyn Pike turned the first sod of soil on May 22<sup>nd</sup>. Construction of the school was of a very rapid pace. Fortnightly meetings were held with the builder (WP Contractors) and architect (Minx) to ensure progress was on track. Many parents were of the opinion that the school would not be completed for the start of the school year. There was a huge final push by the original staff to have classrooms ready for the students for day 1 of the 2009 school year. We opened the school for students and parents the Sunday prior to the start of the school year with 8 teachers and 113 students. Now in our 9th year, our amazing school commenced the 2017 year with 1048 energetic students all eager to learn and take all opportunities before them.

#### **Student Enrolment**

Census day, 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2017 recorded student enrolments at 1048.4 students across 46 classrooms (decrease of 2 classes from 2016) There has been a general slowing of enrolments throughout the year as we witnessed a more transient population of students in and out and the first year of a number of new schools in the area! Prep enrolments remained high from 151 in 2016 to 141 in 2017 which is testament to our enrolment officer, prep team leader and prep team. Well done to all for the work invested into K-P transitions.

#### 2017 Staffing

Indeed, a highlight of the school year is the commitment and dedication to all students from our entire staff! We produced a stable 2017 workforce to cover all program planning across the school and various programs that we offer. Congratulations to all 2017 staff for your continued hard work and efforts and your professionalism in engaging and inspiring our 1048 students. A fantastic team effort in our 9th year with well over 100 teaching and education support staff in our educational institution. To each and every one of you, congratulations on a big team effort and your amazing attitude and approach to this deep and complex work. The commitment and dedication shown by all staff to commence another year at LPS was clearly evident across all levels during our initial start up program to commence the 2017 year. Feedback from parents throughout the year was extremely positive and there was a level of appreciation in all your work to teach, inspire, grow, develop and care for our students. There were a number of departures due to maternity leave with staff either starting or growing their families and opportunities at other schools and the recruiting at the end of the 2017 school year allows for us to be very excited for the 2018 school year. The most important resource and asset at any school is the staff and in ours, I am truly grateful and proud of. I very much look forward to leading and working with this group of amazing professionals once again in 2018 and we all strive forward to further improve our student learning outcomes and take Laurimar PS from good to great.

#### **Organisation / Class Sizes**

Our 2017 workforce plan composition comprised the following;

46 classes at Laurimar Primary School. The following education setting was arranged accordingly;

Prep x 7, Grade 1 x 7, Grade 2 x 7, Grade 3 x 7, Grade 4 x 6, Grade 5 x 6 and Grade 6 x 6.

Class sizes were well below the state average again this year with Prep to 2 averages of 20.5 students or less and Gr.3 to 6 average of 24 students. An overall class size average across our entire school of 23.0. These figures represent excellent averages across the school and are well under the current Departmental benchmarks and expectations across the state allowing for maximum student learning for each individual.



#### **Education Week**

One of the most important events on the State Education Calendar was celebrated once again in May and provides an excellent opportunity for the school to showcase the collective talents of both students and staff of Laurimar Primary School. Many thanks to Steph Pearce for the innovative and exciting amazing Race Theme of our Open Evening.

We are extremely proud of our school and view this as an important way to showcase our great school to the wider community. There was once again an excellent response to the 2017 Grandparents Day (2500 plus grandparents) as always and is an embedded part of our school culture and history.

The open day program allowed for many parents to walk through our classrooms which were on display and see their children and teachers in action. We had a fantastic turnout on these events for Education week and many prospective parents visiting throughout. Another huge success for Laurimar Primary School in 2017.

#### **Camping Program**

Our 2017 camping program was once again another huge highlight of the year without a glitch and comprised the Grade 1 Dinner and Disco, Grade 2 Sleepover, Year 3 Camp to Billabong Ranch in **Echuca**, Year 4 Camp to **Phillip Island** Adventure Resort, Year 5 Camp to **Warrnambool** (second time) and finally our Year 6 Camp to **Anglesea** Recreation Camp. A special thank-you to all staff and parents for making our camping program possible and the success that it was in 2017. The increase in student's confidence and their ability to give things a go is clear evidence of the impact and their sense of independence development.

I am sure all parents and staff would agree, it is certainly a thorough and unique camping experience that we offer our students here at Laurimar Primary School!

#### **Out School Hours Care/Vacation Program**

Many thanks once again to our OSHC Program Leader, Emma Renn, fellow leaders Clint Cotter, Julie Bamford, Shannon Grech and Rowena Manser and her outstanding leadership and innovation of staff for an incredible year of growth in our Mod 9 building. 2017 also had the success of another successful year of opportunity for our Vacation Care/ Holiday Program which has been very popular and moves from strength to strength during each holiday break. The continued success of the program provides Emma and the team the impetus and the strength to strive for applying for 'Excellence' – ACECQA' in all areas under the accreditation framework. A feat in which only one school in Australia has achieved. Our School Council oversee the general operation of our unique OSHC program and generously supports the many school community initiatives including community garden, War Memorial, basketball goals, Welfare Program, security fences and gates and assisted the construction of the cover-way. We wish Emma and her dedicated, caring and professional staff the best of luck on obtaining their goals and efforts through 2017 and beyond. A sensational team and cultural effort of success at our school.

#### **Literacy / Numeracy Program**

The strong teaching of Literacy and Numeracy is the foundation of our curriculum and is at the core of our business of what we do here at Laurimar Primary School. The staff are to be commended on their ability to provide all students with such a high quality Literacy and Numeracy curriculum, practice innovation and teach with engaging learning tasks all year. 2017 Naplan Data produced another positive result in year 3 and 5 and continues to head in the right direction. This facet of the school is something we should all be very proud of. The results have our Year 3 cohort at or above state benchmarks across all areas with some improvement in year 5 and the learning gain from year 3 to 5. Our 1-1 iPad program from Years 1-6 provides an additional tool and resource and takes the student learning to a higher level sparking curiosity amongst all children, providing engagement to support learning. We have maintained a relentless commitment of 10 hours of literacy and 5 hours of numeracy every week and this is non-negotiable throughout the entire school. Some very exciting initiatives were achieved in 2017 particularly with VOICES writing and the consolidation across the school with the Café' approach where we were able to adopt the services of experienced educational consultant Lynn Watts for literacy and Rob Vingerhoets for numeracy. All students look forward to engaging in our Laurimar RAW (Reading and Writing) program each day. All staff are committed and dedicated to their continuous learning and improvement ensuring we constantly measure and monitor the improvement of student learning outcomes across the school.



#### **Parent Helper Classes**

Once again, to train, skill up and educate our parent community, Robyn Greenwood and Deb Purser facilitated our Parent Helper classes throughout the 2017 school year. These sessions were well attended and allows for parent helpers to support our teachers and students within the classroom program. Parents are required to attend these sessions and sign confidentiality agreements when wanting to participate in the classroom. We are fortunate to have Robyn and Deb's experience and expertise in our school to run these excellent programs' for our parent community in a bid to help improve student learning outcomes and our school greatly appreciates their support.

#### **Energy Breakthrough Experience**

Once again, an amazing opportunity was provided for our Year 5/6 students in the form of our EB program as part of the 2017 RACV Energy Breakthrough up at Maryborough in November. Forty-one lucky participants had been preparing strategically since June and had a memorable 4-day experience at this unique event. Now in its 5<sup>th</sup> year for our school, 3 teams, The Dragons, Phoenix and Gryphons performed admirably and made our school very proud by giving it their all during the 14-hour endurance event often battling some unfortunate luck in racing but were forever resilient in their ability to overcome roll overs, crashes, heat and mechanical issues. Once again, we are very lucky to be able to provide an opportunity of this magnitude to our students. This is all made possible due to the incredible drive, commitment and passion from Mr. Rhett McDonald, ably assisted by Mrs Mel Gibson, Deb Purser, Tracy Sims and their support crew of passionate and hardworking teachers and parents. A special mention to Craig Plant, Steve Howe and Glen Dane for providing the mechanical and engineering expertise to allow for our vehicles to be so proficient during the event. It was also uplifting to see former participants in Nicholas, Caleb, Zane and Hayden. Congratulations to all EB team members involved in the 2017 event and for being such wonderful participants. Our students are very fortunate to have this opportunity in our school and I am sure the next wave of lucky students await the 2018 version to create their own piece of history!

#### **Clubs Program**

One of the great program's and opportunities once again on offer to our students in 2016 was in the form of our 'Clubs' program where we offer students some 12 structured opportunities to join a club that they demonstrate a level of interest or a passion in.

The range and diverse engaging Clubs on offer is a credit to the staff who lead these and our students who take up the opportunity. I would like to thank all staff who volunteered their time at lunchtimes to give our students these fantastic opportunities and help add to the great culture of Laurimar Primary School.

#### **VIP Club**

In 2017, our second year of the popular VIP Club was conducted and is specifically designed to meet the needs of those students who find the playground and school yard overwhelming at times. This program was supported by teaching staff and education support staff and provided up to 50 students the opportunity to participate in games, craft, sensory activities and structured social interaction to ensure success during lunchtimes for each individual. #### 2017 Chinese/ Mandarin program

2017 was very busy year in learning Mandarin at Laurimar. We welcomed our Assistant Chinese Teacher Ms Lei to join Chinese team on February. Ms Lei delivered Chinese cultural and language program to younger students with support from classroom teachers. Prep to Year 2 students learned vocabulary and practised to introduce themselves in Chinese.

Ms Chao run a Chinese cultural club on Wednesday and many students from Year 3 and 4 had lots of fun there. They learned traditional Chinese fan dance and ribbon dance and were very proud to perform it on Grandparents day. Year 3 and 4 students enjoyed learning some scientific content in Chinese and was able to label parts of fruits and vegetable in target language.

Ms Luo and Ms Chao had planned fun activities for Year 5 and 6 to engage them in using Chinese in their daily life. Students are encouraged to compare languages (Chinese with English) and cultural differences. We had fourteen lucky students in Year 5 and 6 went China with wonderful Mrs Purser and Mrs Bloomfield on



Term three. They spent two weeks in Nanjing to learn Mandarin and experience Chinese cultural on first hand.

Laurimar primary school was very proud to host temporary international students from China in 2017 and they are supported in whole school community. They participated in daily learning routines with their Australian classmates and they also had chance to share their Chinese knowledge with our students

#### Year 5/6 China Trip

The highlight for 14 year 5/6 students was their incredible journey to China in 2017. Since 2014, we have made the annual Pilgrimage and commitment to Engaging Asia and building strong and authentic relations with our Asian Neighbors. An opportunity presented once again through our connection with the Victorian Principal's Association to travel with a party of 50 other teachers and students from 5 schools across Victoria to Nanjing in the Jiangsu Provence of China. 12 lucky students from LPS attended 10 memorable days of schooling at Jinling Primary (population of over 3000 students over 2 campuses). Our year 5/6 adventurers once again made our school extremely proud through the many rich, culturally diverse and engaging activities that they were immersed in. Many thanks to Mrs Deb Purser and Mrs Hannah Bloomfield for their incredible high level of hard work, organization, leadership support and care that they provided our students for the 14 days away from their precious families. They both demonstrate a high level of experience and care in order for our school to be able to successfully active our goals when it comes to this program.

Thanks to School Council for continuing to support the vision of our Chinese Program in the school and consolidating an amazing opportunity for our students and staff. As part of our strong sister school partnership, Laurimar Primary School had the opportunity to host many Chinese students throughout the year. This enables us to fortify our partnership with China in our educational and hope that this continues for many years to come.

In 2017, we were able to continue our consolidation of the Chinese Teacher Assistant Program (TAP) for Prep-2. Students were immersed in a weekly, 30-minute language program and is a wonderful grounding for when they enter the Year 3-6 Chinese/ Mandarin program.

#### **Grade Six Graduation**

Our school was able to celebrate our Grade 6 Graduation for the first time at the magnificent Bendigo Bank Community Stadium in Diamond Creek. Congratulations to all involved in this memorable occasion for our graduating students and their families. Year 3 and 4 students are introduced to our sports program, with Year 3 students competing in their classes to become familiar with the process.
