Principal's Report

Shopping Centre and Woolworths

Throughout our 11 school years at Laurimar Primary, we have always requested that in the event your child needs to attend the shops over the road and in particular shopping at Woolworths that no students in school uniform should attend unsupervised. In the event your child is required to pick up a message before or after school, a note with parental consent should be presented at school notifying that they will be shopping on your behalf during these times on their own. We have noticed that some children have been going to the shops unattended before or after school. Please have this conversation with your child that there is to be <u>no unsupervised</u> loitering around the shopping centre precinct in the Laurimar School Uniform.

Mobile Phone Permit

In the event that your child requires the use of a mobile phone in Primary School, they will be required to obtain a school mobile phone permit from the office, have it signed by parents/ guardian and return to me for our records. A reminder that if this is the case <u>ALL phones are turned off</u> once a student has entered the school ground and is to be turned back on when departing the school. Mobile phones are not to be turned on or used during school hours from 9am - 3.30pm. Please come and see me in the office if you require any further clarification.

School Council Elections

Over the next few weeks we will be conducting our school council election process. School Council is a wonderful way to bring your ideas, planning, experience and knowledge to help inform the future direction and decision making at a whole school level. It is a wonderful investment in your child/ren and our school, where you will work as part of a dedicated and committed team.

Assistant Principal's Report


FEEDBACK @LPS

As part of developing our feedback strategies at Laurimar Primary School this year, we are focusing on 'The Learning Pit'. Every classroom has completed a lesson or lessons to introduce the Learning Pit and have a pit in the classroom to refer to when needed, to support their learning.

The Learning Pit is an analogy to help our students develop a learning mindset. It describes the process that we go through when learning, so that our children understand that it is okay to feel confused or not sure and that they have strategies and ways of thinking that they can use, such as our 'You Can Do It Foundations' that can assist them to get to the other side of the pit, (master the skill or concept).

The Learning Pit analogy is also important in that it gives students control over their own learning even when it is hard and challenging, which is one of our school's learning goals. It's about helping to teach our student's how to move forward and knowing where to go to next. Learning, when done with the learning pit analogy in mind, helps to put our students in the driver's seat of learning.

It is vital that the home and school work together in order for our students to really jump into the learning pit analogy and to look at their learning as lifelong with all the ups and downs. Have a conversation with your child/ren about the importance of the 'Learning Pit' and how they can use it when they are stuck or challenged when learning.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS - CSEF PAYMENTS

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover part of the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$125 for primary school students

How to Apply

Student Accident Insurance, Ambulance Cover Arrangements and Private Property brought to school.

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Parents are reminded that the school does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents/guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Reasonably low cost accident insurance policies are available from commercial insurers should you require one.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

- Never agree to meet someone in person that I have only met online, and I will tell
 my parents if someone asks to meet me.
- Accept my parents or carer as a 'Friend' on social media providing they ask for my permission before posting or commenting on my content, and they speak to me first if they see something they don't agree with on my profiles.
- Not respond to emails, instant messages, messages or friend requests from people I don't know.
- Never send someone a photo of myself online without checking with my parents or carer first.
- Learn how to block and report people online and tell my parents or carer immediately if doing this.
- Ask for permission before downloading any apps, games or software, so my parents or carer can check these are appropriate for my age and won't harm the device.
- Teach my parents or carer about the internet, apps, games and websites I enjoy.
- Agree to the online time limits set by my parents or carer and put my devices to bed at night to help me get a restful sleep.

Canteen

2019 News from the Canteen!

With the start of the New Year comes the need to reset your child/ren's grade in Munch Monitor. Until you have done this you are unable to order and it will look like the canteen is closed through the Munch Monitor ordering page. Go to their profile and ensure that they are in the correct class. A current picture of your child/ren is also very helpful for canteen staff, this way we can quickly identify them, particularly new students.

If you are new to Laurimar Primary School our canteen operates 5 days a week for recess & lunch. When placing your child/ren's lunch order go to Munch Monitor website and place it by the 9:15am cut-off time. With recess orders the students need to come and collect these from us at the start of recess. If you order a frozen treat for your child/ren's lunch, they will get a stamp on their bag to come and collect it once the lunch time bell goes. The students must bring this bag to the canteen to collect their treat.

One of Munch Monitors functions is "Spending Money". This allows your child/ren to come to the canteen without the worry that they will misplace their change. You set their spending limit to daily/weekly, then they simply come to the window, tell us their name and grade, then we complete the transaction on the computer.

The canteen is always looking for parent helpers, if you could spare an hour or two at some stage during the week, we would be very grateful. Duties could include baking biscuits, packing lunch tubs, restocking shelves and of course serving the students at recess & lunch times. It's great to see your own child/ren's faces light up when they see you in the canteen.

We would like to thank ALL the student and parent volunteers that have helped out so far in the canteen. It's wonderful to see new faces and old ones too!


Walk to School Day —21st Feb
