Focus on Numeracy: Busting Common Mathematical Myths

Most mathematics does not make sense to me

Unfortunately, a lot of 'school mathematics' was often taught without meaning. It is difficult for students to make sense of it. It may be that your own experience of mathematics has been limited to 'school mathematics'. You may rely on procedures and rules that you cannot readily apply to everyday contexts.

In today's classrooms, we emphasise learning mathematics with understanding rather than remembering rules and procedures which may not 'make sense'. Mathematics makes sense when taught with an emphasis on developing deep understanding.

Assistant Principal's Report

NAPLAN

Wow what a busy week it has been with all things 'Laurimar' happening and NAPLAN Testing for years 3 and 5 being completed as well.

Congratulations to all students for their work and effort with these tests and to our teachers for preparing our students so well.

We look forward to receiving our NAPLAN results in late August, early September.

SPELLING @ LPS

At Laurimar Primary School our teaching of spelling is based on Sound Waves. The Sound Waves synthetic phonics approach focuses on the process of synthesising (i.e. taking small parts and putting them together to form a whole). It uses a sound-to-letter strategy which acknowledges that sounds can be represented more than one way in written form. This approach focuses first on phonemes — the basic units of sound. It then explores the letters that represent these sounds and how they can be put together to form written words. Systematic, synthetic phonics is a proven way to teach spelling.

Successful spelling also relies on understanding that words can be constructed from meaningful parts such as prefixes, suffixes and Greek and Latin roots. We explicitly teach students the meaning and spelling of these word parts, which allows them to read and spell complex words correctly.

Find below our Sound Waves foci for the next two weeks for each year level. There are great activities that you can do at home to support your child in developing these vital understandings they are learning in their classroom. Some of these are finding objects that begin with these phonemes, segmenting words with the phonemes into the individual sounds that make the word and completing the related activities on the Sound Waves online site. Your child has the password needed for this.



Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Laurimar Primary School is excited to be participating.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2019.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.
