We are looking for people who are committed to improving the educational outcomes for all our students at LPS. Effective councils have a broad range of experience, skills and expertise. Face-to- face and online training is also available to help councillors develop the skills and knowledge for the job. Parents find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging to their school.

School Council Elections 2018

At the beginning of each school year, School Council elections are held. Please read the following information in relation to becoming a member of the Laurimar Primary School Council. Nominations close at 4.00pm on Monday 28th February, 2017. School Council elections need to take place over the next few weeks.

What is a School Council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within state wide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the School Council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this
 category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be parent members at their child's
 school as long as they are not employed at the school.
- A mandated elected DET employee category.
 Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council.
 The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional community member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the council because
 of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be community members.
 The term of office for all members is two years. Half the members must retire each year, creating vacancies
 for the annual school council elections.
- An optional community member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the council

 creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of connectedness and belonging to Laurimar Primary School.

An election needs to be conducted for members of the School Council of Laurimar Primary School. A nomination form is attached to the newsletter and must be lodged by 4.00pm on Monday 28th February, 2017.

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school. The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows:

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, a notice to that effect and calling for further nominations will be posted in a prominent position at the school.

Student Attendance

At our school, we highly value and respect the importance of student attendance. Laurimar Primary School strongly encourages our students to reach a minimum of 95% attendance. Each year, a number of students are able to attain 100% attendance. This is under our every minute counts philosophy and 'It's Not OK to be Away' strategy. Unless your child is sick and unfit to attend, it is expected that your child will be at school on every other day. Our teachers will regularly be discussing the importance of attendance and consistency and will update their students on how they are tracking.

On behalf of our school, I would like to congratulate our school leaders for the wonderful way in which they conducted themselves at Monday's Badge Ceremony.

Such a proud moment and our school is in such a solid place with such dynamic and diverse leaders coming through.

Teacher Professional Practice Days- What does this mean for Laurimar Primary School and our students?

As part of the Education State initiatives, we achieve excellence by consistently focusing on improving the achievements and lifting the standards of learners across Victoria, whether it is through improving the quality of educational services or changing the way we teach. The most important thing we can do to improve student outcomes is to develop and improve the skills of our teachers who have the greatest impact and influence on the students in their care. The Victorian Government will continue to provide opportunities to develop professional, passionate teachers and principals and equip them with the right knowledge and skills for a modern, 21st Century classroom that best prepares them for their future. To ensure we support the learning and development of not only our students, but our teachers too; we are committed to providing professional development opportunities for our teaching workforce here at Laurimar Primary School.

What are Professional Practice Days for our teaching staff?

Under the 2017 Victorian Government Schools Agreement, teachers will receive one day per term when they are out of the classroom to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning. This will be on a pro rata basis that caters for each teacher's workload. For a full time teacher, they can access four days for the year (1 per term). Part time (0.5) can access 2 days or 1 day each semester.

What this means for your child?

Your child's teacher will spend four days per year further developing their skills in areas that are aligned to the school priorities and initiatives outlined as part of the Education State. Your child will directly benefit from these improvements in their daily learning. On these days, a CRT (Casual Relief Teacher) will be provided with the learning plan for the day so they will be well equipped to assist your child with their learning needs. We are scheduling the professional practice days ahead of time so there is minimal impact to students and, where possible, there is consistency in teaching. Many thanks for your support of our professional teaching staff as we continue to refine our practice and strive for teaching excellence that ultimately improves each child's performance and educational outcomes.

Keep up the positive work with your children working hand in hand with our great school and I look forward to catching up with you all around our school grounds.

CURRICULUM @LPS


Wow! What a busy time it has been in Curriculum over the last two weeks at Laurimar Primary School.

SPELLING


Our spelling program began in earnest this week with a study into the 'b, bb' phoneme. Hopefully your children have taught you 'bounce balloons bbb'. As well as learning about the phoneme sound, students have developed word lists, investigated the letters (graphemes) that make the b as in balloon sound, made generalisations about what graphemes you would use depending on where you hear the sound in the word and completed a variety of other tasks across the school to deepen their knowledge of this phoneme. Just reminding you there is an online component to the program, which supports our home school partnership philosophy, to get the best results for your child. By using your child's password you will gain access to activities to further support your child in this learning.

NUMERACY

Throughout 2018 Laurimar Primary School will be working with Numeracy consultant Kathy Palmer. Last Monday Kathy worked with the prep to 6 Teaching and Learning Leaders and myself on the current practices we have at LPS in mathematics and where to next.

On the last day of this term March 29, which is a pupil free day, Kathy will be presenting to the whole staff on the 'Big Ideas' in mathematics. The Big Ideas focus on best practice in developing student's understanding of 'Trusting the Count', 'Place Value', 'Multiplicative Thinking' and 'Partitioning' at the primary school level. We certainly look forward to further enhancing our already excellent practices.

Melbourne University - Science of Learning Partnership

Another very exciting project throughout 2018 will be our work with Professor John Hattie and his team. Professor Hattie is the Director of the Melbourne Education Research Institute at the University of Melbourne as well as the Chair of the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL). Our project will focus on 'FEEDBACK' with a strong emphasis on exemplar student feedback, so at Laurimar Primary School we have maximum impact on learning for our students. The project will involve full day and evening classes for the team, with the first being held last Wednesday. We are very excited to have the opportunity to work with such revered educationalists.

It certainly is a very exciting time in at Laurimar Primary School.

Spotlight on Social Emotional Learning

In SEL classes right across the school this term we are exploring "Relationships". Our first two lessons have focused on either Values (Years 1-4) and Character Strengths (Years 5 & 6). Have conversations with your family about the following:

RESPECT: We show respect when we treat others the way we like to be treated. We show respect when we look people in the eye and speak politely. We can show respect to other people's belongings, our own belongings and to school property. We should also respect ourselves and *like* ourselves, just the way we are.

RESPONSIBILITY: Is being the sort of person who can be relied on when asked to do a job. It's taking on a leader-ship role and completing it to the best of your ability. It's caring for your pet. It's taking responsibility for your own behaviour and decisions. It's being reliable and always charging your iPad every night. It's taking responsibility for doing your homework (reading, Mathletics etc) every night.

INTEGRITY: Is doing the right thing...even when no one is watching! It's making good choices (especially if someone is encouraging you to do the wrong thing). And, when you say you are going to do something, you DO IT!

<u>HONESTY</u>: Honesty means always telling the truth. It means not making up stories like the boy who cried wolf because no one will believe you when you are really telling the truth. It means owning up and telling the truth about your behaviour. You get a reputation for being honest when you always tell the truth.

FREEDOM: Freedom is people choosing to play what they want to play, to eat what they want to eat, to wear special clothes for their culture and to think what they want to think, without anyone being critical of their choices and opinions.

<u>BEING FAIR</u>: We show fairness when we play by the rules of the game and we don't change the rules in the middle of a game. It is fair to take turns to speak and to take turns to go first in a game. It shows fairness to make sure everyone gets a go.

<u>CARING</u>: We show caring when we look after others and when we include others in groups or games rather than exclude. We show we care for ourselves when we eat healthy food and get enough sleep. We care for the environment when we keep our school clean and pick up any rubbish we might see.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS - CSEF PAYMENTS

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students

Change of Information

If over the holiday period you have changed your address, telephone/mobile number or place of work details, could you please inform our office staff as soon as possible as we need to have Current information for emergency purposes. If your child attends before or after school care, ensure you let the OSHC Team know of any changes as well. Your assistance with this would be greatly appreciated.

Lost Clothing and Property

Is your child/children's clothing labelled? Please check all clothing, hats, lunchboxes, etc. to make sure your child's name is clearly visible. If items are clearly labelled items can be returned to the correct owner. We appreciate the efforts in purchasing your child's uniform and the associated cost so t is imperative to be clearly labelled.

From the Office

Student Accident Insurance, Ambulance Cover Arrangements and Private Property brought to school.

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Parents are reminded that the school does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents/guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Reasonably low cost accident insurance policies are available from commercial insurers should you require one.


