TEACHER PARENT LEARNING CONFERENCES WEDNESDAY MAY 1ST

On Wednesday May 1st we are holding the term two Student Learning Conferences. **This conference is for parents and teachers only**. This day is a normal school day for students as the conferences begin at 3:50pm and conclude at 8:40pm. The purpose of the conference is to inform you of your child's current academic and social achievement and discuss future goals for their learning. You will be provided with an information sheet from the meeting with your class teacher to assist you in supporting your child's learning. We greatly appreciate the learning support we receive at home from parents, as it makes the learning more powerful.

To book your conference you need to use Compass School Manager. Yesterday you received a News Feed on COMPASS which informed you how to book your appointment with the classroom teacher/s and Expressive Education teacher/s

(Art, PE, Social Emotional Learning, STEM Science and Chinese) and Mrs Ally Makowski (Enrichment Program) If your child is involved in this extra program. Please note you **DO NOT** have to make an appointment with the Expressive Education teachers, but they are available if you wish to.

Mr Andrew Tenson 4C classroom teacher will be unavailable on this evening so parents will not be able to make a booking. Mr Tenson will contact you individually to make an alternative arrangement.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN is fast approaching for students in Years 3 and 5. NAPLAN is a national assessment that is undertaken every year in mid May.

Students are tested in four areas:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy

The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals about student achievement, which can be used to inform teaching and learning programs. NAPLAN tests provide point-in-time information regarding student progress in literacy and numeracy and are intended to complement teacher judgement and the wide range of formal and informal testing programs that are already used at Laurimar Primary School. As with all single assessments, NAPLAN test results are not intended to be used in isolation from other school-based assessment programs.

This year NAPLAN is being held on Tuesday 14th, Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th May. On the Tuesday students will complete Language Conventions and Writing, on the Wednesday Reading and on the Thursday Mathematics.

A letter will be coming home early next term to provide you with further NAPLAN information. If you have any questions or concerns please contact myself or your classroom teacher.

Gallipoli War

All I could hear was the dark ocean crashing against the hull of the ship. It was dark as night and all was quiet. I was a sailor in the navy. My name is William Simmons. I am 28 years of age and have trained as a naval officer for 12 years. This is the first day of the Gallipoli War for naval officers.

We had over 300 men on board our warship. We had been sent to Gallipoli to weaken the Turkish Army. It was 02:55 and we sent out the first tow boats to near the shore. They were pulling life boats, cutters & launches with 133 men in total. The plan was to stop 2.5km off shore and then quietly drive in. At 90 meters we released our life boat with 28 men at 04:15. The other rowboats did the same.


After 5 quiet minutes the beach lit up indicating the Turks had seen us. The soldiers got confused when they saw the 9th, 10th & 11th battalions. At 04:35 we got the word they had started to climb Ari Burnu, moving towards the first ridge. It was 04:40 and we dispatched the second wave of men to the shore.

The first units of the ANZAC main force moved towards the shore. The first units of the ANZAC main force moved towards the shore at 05:00. All we could do was wait until it was safe to dispatch out the divisional staff. After 2,2 hours the 1st Australian division commander Major General William Bridges landed with the divisional staff at 0720. In the next 40 minutes the 3500 ANZAC's fought the 300-400 Turkish soldiers. At 10:00—10:30 we sent out the divisional HO to come ashore.

At 11:00 the first men of the New Zealand infantry brigade started landing. They planned to strengthen the Australian soldiers throughout the day.

So, we had gotten the soldiers to Gallipoli. Our job was done. All we could do now was bring the injured to the hospital ships. Our job was done, but the soldiers had much to do. This was the first day for the naval officers in the Gallipoli war.

First Aid

Anaphylaxis

Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and can be potentially life threatening. Laurimar Primary has numerous students with various food allergies that can result in anaphylaxis.

Any one of the below list of symptoms may be signs of Anaphylaxis:

- Difficult/ Noisy breathing
- Swelling of the tongue
- Swelling / tightness in throat
- Difficulty talking and / or hoarse voice
- Wheeze or persistent cough
- Persistent dizziness or collapse
- Pale and floppy (young children)

Classes that have a student with anaphylaxis are provided a letter at the beginning of the year requesting that they refrain from bringing in any food items that may trigger an anaphylactic response in the child at risk. In this way, we can continue to keep our students safe.


Two of the main purposes of our Anaphylaxis Policy is to:
