PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2019 marked our 11th year in Education for Laurimar Primary allowing our school to continue to build and consolidate on our achievements, success, and academic and personal growth for each and every student. Our goal to provide rich educational achievement and opportunities for each child was a major focus. The year was highlighted by the multitude of educational opportunities provided to our highly engaged students. Teaching and learning with a focus on our strong literacy and numeracy programs continued to be a feature. This allowed the time and space for our teachers to deliver high quality content around CAFÉ Reading Strategies, and our VOICES Writing program which was introduced as a result of targeted and specific professional development initiatives. The Big Ideas In Mathematics in our Numeracy Program continued to develop knowledge, consistency and understanding across the school along with a strong focus on quality feedback for all students.

We have continued to deliver and enhance engaging educational programs that respond to the directions of the Department of Education and Training (DET) under the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes. New Initiatives under the Education State such as the Literacy and Numeracy strategy have been implemented where our school's focus on Building Practice Excellence and Empowering Students to Build School Pride were once again made a strong priority. In 2019, the third year of our 4-year Strategic Plan, we also drew upon strategies that foster connectedness between our school and each family with a strong emphasis on building relationships between staff, students and families. Greater lines of communication were further fostered and embedded based on survey feedback from community members.

As a school, we continued to build upon our strong 'Learning Architecture' and continued to reflect and evaluate its effectiveness in the classroom. Through all learning programs, the dedicated 10 hours of literacy (RAW Program, CAFE and VOICES writing) and 5 hours of numeracy each week build proficiency across these areas. Throughout the 2019 school year, we aimed to once again embed our stance in the Doreen and wider community as a Dynamic Educational Institution that creates a strong academic language and culture when it comes to our learning and provide excellence in Primary Education to ALL students and families.

Our school curriculum and opportunities provided through the year has been highly engaging, diverse and extensive. Our strong Teaching and Learning Leader (TLL) culture allowed for 5 lead teachers (Teaching and Learning Leaders) to coach, model, reflect, inspire and support teachers right across the school in being able to focus on their classroom practice and delivering consistency for students. To complement effective teaching, we were also able to offer:

- our strong Clubs program initiative
- National Young Leaders Day at Melbourne Convention Centre
- 2019 Energy Breakthrough Program in Maryborough through the Human Powered Vehicle Event where we entered 3 teams
- Whole School Production over 3 nights at Plenty Ranges Arts and Convention Centre
- A Diverse Visual and Performing Arts program, Physical and Sport Education program
- Chinese Mandarin program encompassing our China Exchange Trip which unfortunately we had to postpone for 2019 due to low interest
- a focussed and strong Social and Emotional Learning program
- A strong partnership with Whittlesea Lodge Aged Care facility and its staff and residents

All programs and teacher delivery within these, aimed to inspire through a multitude of engaging activities and strategies. In 2019, we certainly were able to provide a broad range of extra-curricular activities with maximum learning opportunities for all our students.

There were many wonderful highlights throughout the 2019 school year and I have detailed several of these further in this report.

The successes achieved during the 2019 school year are once again attributed to the large team of hard working professional teaching staff whom work tirelessly to connect, invest, engage, teach, motivate and inspire their students during each available session every day. Our HIGHLIGHTS and ACHIEVEMENTS for the 2019 School Year

The following list represents some of the fulfilling achievements and opportunities for students and staff that come to mind when we look back on the success of the 2019 school year at Laurimar Primary School. We can recall many of the engaging activities provided by our entire staff throughout the school during our 11th year of education.

Years leading up to the 2019 school year

A brief school history begins with construction of our new school commencing back in 2008, when the Minster of Education at this point of time, the Hon. Bronwyn Pike turned the first sod of soil on May 22nd. Construction of the school was of a very rapid pace. Fortnightly meetings were held with the builder (WP Contractors) and architect (Minx) to ensure progress was on track. Many parents were of the opinion that the school would not be completed for the start of the school year. There was a huge final push by the original staff to have classrooms ready for the students for day 1 of the 2009 school year. We opened the school for students and parents the Sunday prior to the start of the school year with 8 teachers and 113 students. Now in our 11th year, our amazing school commenced the 2019 year with 989 energetic students all eager to learn and take all opportunities before them.

Student Enrolment

Census day, 28th February, 2019 recorded student enrolments at 989.4 students across 43 classrooms (decrease of 1 class from 2018) There has been a general slowing of enrolments throughout the year as we witnessed a more transient population of students in and out and the first year of a number of new schools in the area! Prep enrolments remained high from 151 in 2016 to 141 in 2019 which is testament to our enrolment officer, prep team leader and prep team. Well done to all for the work invested into K-P transitions.

2019 Staffing

Indeed, a highlight of the school year is the commitment and dedication to all students from our entire LPS staff! We produced a stable 2019 workforce to cover all program planning across the school and the various programs that we offer. Congratulations to all 2019 staff for your continued hard work and efforts and your professionalism in engaging and inspiring our 989 students. A fantastic team effort in our 11th year with well over 100 teaching and education support staff in our educational institution. To each and every one of you, congratulations on a big team effort and your amazing attitude and approach to this deep and complex work. The commitment and dedication shown by all staff to commence another year at LPS was clearly evident across all levels during our initial start up program to commence the 2019 year. Feedback from parents throughout the year was extremely positive and there was a level of appreciation in all your work to teach, inspire, grow, develop and care for our students. There were a number of departures due to maternity leave with staff either starting or growing their families, or staff taking up opportunities at other schools, and the recruiting at the end of the 2019 school year allows for us to be very excited for the 2020 school year. The most important resource and asset at any school is the staff, and I am truly grateful and proud of ours. I very much look forward to leading and working with this group of amazing professionals once again in 2020 as we all strive forward to further improve our student learning outcomes and take Laurimar PS from good to great.

Organisation / Class Sizes

Our 2019 workforce plan composition comprised the following;

43 classes at Laurimar Primary School. The following education setting was arranged accordingly; Prep x 8, Grade 1 x 6, Grade 2 x 6, Grade 3 x 6, Grade 4 x 6, Grade 5 x 6 and Grade 6 x 5.

Class sizes were well below the state average again this year with Prep to 2 averages of 20.4 students or less and Gr.3 to 6 average of 24.6 students. An overall class size average across our entire school of 23.0. These figures represent below State averages across the school and are well under the current Departmental benchmarks and expectations across the state allowing for maximum student learning for each individual.

Education Week in May



One of the most significant events on the Education State Calendar was celebrated once again in May and provides an excellent opportunity for the school to showcase the collective talents of both students and staff of Laurimar Primary School. Many thanks to Vanessa Thompson (Vanessa the professor) for the innovative and creative STEAM exhibition (Get on the 'Steam' train at LPS) which was the theme of our Open Evening during Education Week. We were able to demonstrate

ideas and activities around Mathematics, Technology, Engineering and Science. There were other exhibitions held on the night for visitors to explore.

We are extremely proud of our school and view this as an important way to showcase our great school to the wider community. There was once again an excellent response to the 2019 Grandparents Day (2000 plus grandparents) as always and is an embedded part of our school culture and history. This is such a beneficial experience for our students and always highlights the pivotal role that grandparents play in their lives.

The open day program during Education Week allowed for many parents to walk through our classrooms which were on display and to see their children and teachers in action. We had a fantastic turnout for these events during Education week with many prospective parents visiting throughout. Another huge success for Laurimar Primary School in 2019 and we look forward to celebrating all things in the Education State in 2020.

Camping Program



Our 2019 camping program was once again another huge highlight of the year for our students where we provide such rich camping experience. The program included a Prep Trek/ Lunch, Grade 1 Dinner and Disco, Grade 2 Sleepover, Year 3 Camp to Billabong Ranch in Echuca, Year 4 Camp to Phillip Island Adventure Resort, Year 5 Camp to Warrnambool and Camp Kangaroobie and finally our Year 6 Camp to Anglesea Recreation Camp. A

special thank-you to all staff and parents for making our camping program possible through their commitment and the success that it was in 2019.

The increase in the students' confidence, their growth of independence and their ability to give things a go, is clear evidence of the impact and success of the camping program.

I am sure all parents and staff would agree, it is certainly a thorough and unique camping experience that we offer our students here at Laurimar Primary School and one that we are very proud of! We look forward to the 2020 version of our camping experince.



Out School Hours Care/Vacation Program



Many thanks once again to our OSHC Program Leader, Emma Renn, fellow leaders Chloe Cornhels, Julie Bamford, Shannon Grech and Rowena Manser for their outstanding leadership and innovation, and to the staff for an incredible year of growth in our Mod 9 building. 2019 also had the success of another successful year of opportunity for our Vacation Care/ Holiday Program which has been very popular and moves from strength to strength during each holiday break. Embedded in the program is our OSHC Demonstration Program that caters for students with disabilities both at after care and during the Vacation care holiday periods. This allows students with disabilities from Concord School,

Northern School for Austism, Diamond Valley SDS and Merriang SDS to access our school program and once again highlights our school's high level of inclusiveness.

The continued success of the program provides Emma and the team the impetus and the strength to strive for applying for 'Excellence' – ACECQA' in all areas under the accreditation framework. A feat in which only one school in Australia has achieved. Our School Council oversee the general

operation of our unique OSHC and OSHC Demonstration programs and generously supports the many school community initiatives including community gardens, War Memorial, basketball courts and goals, Working Bees, Welfare Programs, accessible buildings, security fences and boom gates and assisted in the construction of the cover-way. We wish Emma and her dedicated, caring and professional staff the best of luck on obtaining their goals and efforts through 2020 and beyond. A sensational team and cultural effort that reflects a high level of inclusiveness and adds to the overall success of our school.



Literacy / Numeracy Program

The strong and focussed teaching of Literacy and Numeracy is the foundation of our curriculum and is at the core of our 'Learning Architecture' of what we do here at Laurimar Primary School. The staff are to be commended for their ability to provide all students with such a high quality Literacy and Numeracy curriculum, practice innovation, engage in strong professional learning and teach with engaging learning tasks all year. 2019 Naplan Data produced another positive result in year 3 and 5 and continues to head in the right direction with improvement in writing. This element of our school is something we should all be very proud of. The results have our Year 3 cohort at or above state benchmarks across all areas with some improvement in year 5 and the learning gain from year 3 to 5. Our 1-1 iPad program from Years 2-6 provides an additional tool and resource and takes the student learning to a higher level sparking curiosity amongst all children and providing engagement to support their learning. We have maintained a relentless commitment of 10 hours of literacy and 5 hours of numeracy every week across each classroom and this is non-negotiable throughout the entire school. Some very exciting initiatives were achieved in 2019 particularly with VOICES writing and the consolidation across the school with our CAFE reading approach where we were able to

adopt the services of experienced educational consultant Lynn Watts for literacy. All students look forward to engaging in our Laurimar RAW (Reading and Writing) program each day. Our staff are committed and dedicated to their continuous learning and improvement, ensuring we constantly measure and monitor the improvement of student learning outcomes across the school through regular Proefssional Learning Team Data meetings and then through our Whole School Data team meetings.

Parent Helper Classes

Once again, to train, skill up and educate our parent community, Assistant Principal Deb Purser facilitated our Parent Helper classes throughout the 2019 school year. These sessions were well attended and allows for parent helpers to support our teachers and students within the classroom setting. Under child safety standards within schools, parents are required to attend these sessions, have a current Working With Children's Check and sign confidentiality agreements when wanting to participate in their child's classroom. We are fortunate to have Deb's experience and expertise in our school to run these excellent programs for our parent community in a bid to help improve student learning outcomes and our school greatly appreciates their support to fortify our partnership in learning.

2019 Energy Breakthrough Experience- Maryborough



Once again, our dedicated team of teachers provided an amazing opportunity for our Year 5/6 students in the form of our EB program as part of the 2019 RACV Energy Breakthrough up at Maryborough in November. Forty-one lucky participants had been preparing strategically since June and had a memorable 4-day experience at this unique event. Now in its 7th year for our school, 3 teams, Dragons, Phoenix and Gryphons, performed admirably and made our school very proud. Each team gave their all during

the 14-hour endurance event often battling some unfortunate luck in racing but were forever resilient in their ability to overcome roll overs, crashes, heat and mechanical issues. Once again, we are very lucky to be able to provide an opportunity of this magnitude to our students. Clubs Program

2019 Chinese/ Mandarin program

2019 was a very busy year of learning Chinese Mandarin at Laurimar Primary. We welcomed our Assistant Chinese Teacher Ms Chou Mei to join the Chinese team in February. Ms Mei delivered Chinese cultural and language program to our younger students with support from classroom Chinese teachers, Mrs Chao and Mrs Wang. Prep to Year 2 students learned vocabulary and practised to introduce themselves in Chinese.

Ms Chao ran a Chinese cultural club on Wednesdays and many students from Year 3 and 4 had lots of fun in the program. They learned traditional Chinese fan dance and ribbon dance and were very proud to perform it on Grandparents Day and at other assemblies. Year 3 and 4 students enjoyed learning some scientific content in Chinese and were able to label parts of fruits and vegetable in target language.

Mrs Wang and Ms Chao had planned fun activities for Year 5 and 6 to engage them in using Chinese in their daily life. Students are encouraged to compare languages (Chinese with English) and



cultural differences. Laurimar Primary School was very proud to host 20 temporary International students from our sister school in China in 2019 and they were supported through our whole school community.
