#### **2018 PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

The end of 2018 marks a decade in education here at our school where we can celebrate many wonderful accomplishments through this time. It is hard to believe that 10 full and successful years in education at Laurimar Primary has now been completed since local MP, Danielle Green rang the very first bell to commence classes in February 2009. The 2018 school year was a wonderful opportunity for all stakeholders to achieve success and strong academic and personal growth for each and every student at Laurimar Primary School. Our goal to provide rich and varied educational achievement and opportunities for each child was a major focus. The year was highlighted by a broad range of educational opportunities provided to our highly engaged students through passionate teaching staff who constantly challenge themselves to be better educators. Personalised teaching and learning with a focus on our strong literacy and numeracy programs continued to be a feature, allowing the time and space for our teachers to deliver high quality content around our new whole school spelling program based on 'Sound Waves'. We further developed our CAFÉ Reading Strategies and VOICES writing structure which was introduced as a result of targeted and specific professional development initiatives. We continued to consolidate the knowledge and skills taught by educational consultant, Kathy Palmer through our Numeracy Program, which continued to deepen teacher capacity, encourage consistency of content across year levels through detailed planning and a rich understanding across Prep-6.

We have continued to deliver and enhance engaging educational programs and priorities, which respond to the directions of the Department of Education and Training (DET) under the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes. We continued to embed Education State priorities such as the Literacy and Numeracy Strategy and High Impact Teaching Strategies with a particular emphasis on 'Feedback'. We were able to further develop our school's focus on 'Building Practice Excellence' and 'Empowering Students to Build School Pride' through professional learning and targeted activities. 2018 saw us complete our 2nd year of our 4-year Strategic Plan. We also drew upon strategies that foster connectedness between our school and each family with a strong emphasis on building relationships between staff, students and families.

Through all learning programs, our core 10 hours of literacy (Sound Waves Phonemic Approach, CAFÉ' Reading Program and VOICES structure writing) and 5 hours of numeracy each week, aim to build proficiency across these important curriculum areas. Throughout 2018, we also introduced our new STEM Learning Centre that enables students to creatively explore, enhance their engagement and delve deeper into the world of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. We were once again very proud that through the Laurimar, Doreen and wider community that we are known as a Dynamic Educational Institution that creates a strong academic language around learning architecture when it comes to our student success and provide excellence in Primary Education for ALL students and families in Prep-6.

Our school's specific learning programs, detailed curriculum and opportunities provided through the year has been diverse and extensive for our community. We continued with a strong commitment to our growth coaching model which allowed for 5 Leading Teachers (Teaching and Learning Leaders) to coach, model, challenge, reflect, inspire, build pedagogical knowledge and support teachers in being able to focus on their classroom practice and delivering consistency of practice for students. To complement effective teaching, we were also able to offer our strong Clubs program initiative, Energy Breakthrough Program in Maryborough in the Human Powered

Vehicle Event, Wakikirri Music Production, Diverse Arts program, Physical and Sport Education program, Chinese Mandarin program encompassing our China Exchange Trip and a focussed and strong Social and Emotional Learning program based on YCDI! Education. All programs and teacher delivery within them aim to inspire through a multitude of engaging activities and strategies. In 2018, we were once again able to cater for and provide the maximum amount of diverse learning opportunities and broad range of extra-curricular activities available for all students throughout the year.

There were certainly many memorable highlights throughout the 2018 school year of which I have detailed further in this report.

The successes achieved during the 2018 school year was once again attributed to the large team of hard working professional teaching staff, education support, STRIVE team and OSHC staff whom work tirelessly to engage, teach, motivate and inspire our students during each available session every day. At LPS, our staff adopt the attitude of 'Every Minute Counts' to maximise the learning opportunities for all students. Our professional staff aim to make a positive difference, build confidence and add value to every student in their care, which is a unique feature of our school culture. As a school, we will always work hard to maintain this commitment by employing the best possible teachers through a rigorous recruiting process for each position made available. ## Our HIGHLIGHTS and ACHIEVEMENTS for 2018 School Year

The following represents many of the successful programs, events, achievements and learning opportunities for students and staff when we look back on the wonderful memories of the 2018 school year at Laurimar Primary School. We can recall many of the engaging activities provided by our entire staff throughout the school completing a decade of operation in education. We hope that it will illicit many fond memories of the year.

#### School Context and the years leading up to the 2018 school year

Construction of our new school commenced back in 2008, when the Minster of Education at this time, Bronwyn Pike turned the first sod of soil on May 22<sup>nd</sup>. Construction of the new school was of a very rapid pace. Fortnightly meetings were held with the builder (WP Contractors) and school architect (Minx) to ensure progress remained on track. Many parents were of the opinion that the school would not be completed for the start of the school year. There was a huge final push by the original staff to have classrooms ready for the students to commence the first day of the 2009 school year. We opened the school for learning for our students and parents the Sunday prior to the start of the school year with 8 teachers and 113 students. Now having completed 10 full years of education, our proud school commenced the 2018 year with 968 energetic students all eager to learn and take on all opportunities before them.

#### **Student Enrolment**

On Census day, 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 our recorded student enrolments were at 968.4 students across 45 operational classrooms (a decrease of 1 grade from 2017) There has been a consistent plateau once again this year as we maintain enrolments in the high 900s with enrolments expected to grow slightly in 2019. Prep enrolments remained consistent with 7 grades housing 138 prep students which is testament to our enrolment officer, prep team leader and prep team. Well done to all for the work invested into our K-P transition program where the children are prepared very well.



#### 2018 Staffing

Indeed, a highlight of the school year is the commitment and dedication to all students from our entire staff! We produced a stable 2018 workforce to cover all program planning across the school and various programs that we offer. Congratulations to all 2018 staff for their continued hard work and efforts and for their professionalism in engaging and inspiring our 1048 students. A fantastic team effort in our 9th year with well over 100 teaching and education support staff in our educational institution. To each and every one of you, congratulations on a big team effort and for your amazing attitude and approach to this deep and complex work. The commitment and dedication shown by all staff to commence another year at LPS was clearly evident across all levels during our initial start up program to commence the 2018 year. Feedback from parents throughout the year was extremely positive and there was a level of appreciation in all your work to teach, inspire, grow, develop and care for our students. There were a number of departures due to maternity leave with staff either starting or growing their families and opportunities at other schools. The most important resource and asset at any school is the staff and in ours, I am truly grateful and proud of. I very much look forward to leading and working with this group of amazing professionals once again in 2019 as we all strive forward to further improve our student learning outcomes and take Laurimar PS from good to great.

## **Organization / Class Sizes**

Our 2018 workforce plan composition comprised the following;

45 classes at Laurimar Primary School. The following education setting was arranged accordingly;

Prep x 7, Grade 1 x 6, Grade 2 x 7, Grade 3 x 7, Grade 4 x 6, Grade 5 x 6 and Grade 6 x 6.

Class sizes were well below the state average again this year with Prep to 2 averages of 20.5 students or less and Gr.3 to 6 average of 24 students. An overall class size average across our entire school of 23.0. These figures represent excellent averages across the school and are well under the current Departmental benchmarks and expectations across the state allowing for maximum student learning for each individual.

#### **Education Week**

One of the most important events on the State Education Calendar was celebrated once again in May and provided an excellent opportunity for the school to showcase the collective talents of both students and staff of Laurimar Primary School. Many thanks to Steph Pearce for the innovative and exciting amazing Race Theme of our Open Evening.

We are extremely proud of our school and view this as an important way to showcase our great school to the wider community. There was once again an excellent response to the 2018 Grandparents Day (2500 plus grandparents) as always and is an embedded part of our school culture and history.

The open day program allowed for many parents to walk through our classrooms which were on display and see their children and teachers in action. We had a fantastic turnout on these events for Education week and many prospective parents visiting throughout. Another huge success for Laurimar Primary School in 20

## **Out of School Hours Care/Vacation Program**

In 2018, we continued the great work of our ever-popular and highly sort after OSHC service led by our amazing program leader, Emma Renn and her dedicated program assistants Julie Bamford, , Shannon Grech and Rowena Pearson, along with their broader team of accredited workers. They have formed a dynamic and professional team who generate a homely feel for all students as they continue to benefit from the program. Having a dynamic Before and After Care Service coupled with the ever-popular Vacation Care through the holidays has our program at the forefront and is highly sort after by families in our local area. Congratulations to Emma, her entire team, Helen Haydock (OSHC program committee convenor) and her

broader team on the enormous success of the year in the OSHC program. We look forward to more innovation, activities, strategies and creative ideas through 2019's program.

Many thanks once again to our OSHC Program Leader, Emma Renn, fellow leaders Julie Bamford, Shannon Grech and Rowena Pearson and her outstanding leadership and innovation of staff for an incredible year of growth in our Mod 9 building. 2018 also had the success of another successful year of opportunity for our Vacation Care/ Holiday Program, which has been very popular and moves from strength to strength during each holiday break providing a rich and diverse opportunity for students. The programs also extends more broadly and supports the many school community initiatives including cooking club and community garden, Arts and Crafts, VIP Club, Doreen War Memorial, basketball goals, Welfare Program, security fences and gates, upgrades to playgrounds and assisted the construction of the second cover-way on the bat tennis courts. We wish Emma and her dedicated, caring and professional staff the best of luck on obtaining their goals and efforts through out 2019 and beyond.

## **Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) Demonstration Program**

As a result of the Premier, Mr Daniel Andrews visit to our school in 2017, our school was fortunate enough to be selected as the only mainstream school to run an OSHC Demonstration program that caters for students with disabilities for After School Care and Vacation Care purposes. This is such a fine reflection of us as a school and our high level of inclusiveness, acceptance, patience, tolerance and understanding. The program commenced in term 3, building up enrolments at a steady pace and continues to immerse students through the program on a daily basis and through the holidays. The OSHC Demonstration Program is something that we can all be very proud of.

#### **STRIVE Program**



One of the pleasing features of our school in 2018, was the creation, construction and commencement of the STRIVE room which is an inclusive program that caters for our funded students with additional needs. The program provides an environment and structured learning program that allows for greater student outcomes, sense of achievement and experience of success. This program opened its doors on day 1 of Term 2 and has grown from strength to strength. Students look forward to attending their 3 x 2 hour sessions per week in there.

## **Literacy / Numeracy Program**

In 2018 we reinforced our mantra of learning at LPS with Literacy and Numeracy at the core of our curriculum and the centre of our business of what we do in every classroom each day. The staff are to be congratulated on their ability to provide all students with such a high quality Literacy and Numeracy program, practice innovation and teaching with engaging learning activities and resources in every session. They certainly demonstrate a strong commitment to professional learning and improvement in these key areas. Our 2018 Naplan Data produced another strong result in year 3 and 5 and continues to head in the right direction as we lead similar and network schools producing our best result in the 10 year history of our school. This aspect of our school is something we should all be very proud of. The results have our Year 3 cohort well above state benchmarks across all areas with large improvements in year 5 and the learning gain from year 3 to 5. Our 1-1 iPad program from Years 3-6 provides an additional tool and resource to support

student learning and push to a higher level sparking curiosity amongst all children and providing engagement to support learning. We have maintained a strong culture each week of 10 hours of Literacy and 5 hours of Numeracy and is non-negotiable throughout Prep-6. We continued to consolidate in 2018 our VOICES writing structure, introduced the Sound Waves Phonics Model for spelling and



consolidated across the school our CAFE reading approach where we were able to adopt the services of experienced educational consultant Lynn Watts for Literacy and Kathy Palmer for Numeracy professional learning. All students look forward to engaging in our Laurimar RAW (Reading and Writing) program each day. Our teachers and education support staff are committed and dedicated to their continuous learning and improvement ensuring we constantly measure and monitor the improvement of student learning outcomes across the school to stretch them to higher achievements of success in their learning.

## **Parent Helper Classes**

We again had a commitment to train, skill up and educate our parent community so that they could become parent helpers within the classroom in 2018. Robyn Greenwood and Deb Purser facilitated our Parent Helper classes throughout the year and the feedback is always very positive about building capacity. These sessions were well attended and allows for parent helpers to support our teachers and students within the classroom program. Parents are required to attend these sessions and sign confidentiality agreements when wanting to participate within classrooms. We are fortunate to have Robyn and Deb's experience and expertise in our school to run these excellent programs' for our parent community in a bid to help improve student learning outcomes both at school and at home, fortifying the partnership for learning.

## 2018 Energy Breakthrough Experience

An unforgettable experience was played out this year with our Year 5/6 students in the form of the 2018 RACV Energy Breakthrough up at Maryborough in November. In what was a change of event for us in 2018, our 3 well prepared teams entered for the very first time into the Try-Athlon event. 43 lucky participants had been preparing strategically across the 3 elements since June and had a memorable 4-day experience at this wonderful event. Now in its 7<sup>th</sup> year for LPS, our 3 teams, The Dragons, Phoenix and Gryphons performed admirably well for their first appearance in the event and made our



school very proud by giving it their all during the 4 days and achieving top 10 finishes. We even had one of the teams win the event overall. Once again, we are very lucky to be able to provide an opportunity of this magnitude to our students due to the dedication of our staff and parents. This is all made possible due to the incredible organisation, drive, commitment, hard work and passion from Mr. Brett Hayes, ably assisted by Mr Des Chapman, Deb Purser(2018 winning Team Leader), Kim Ferguson, Tracy Sims and their support crew of passionate and hardworking teachers and parents. A special mention to Simon and Michelle Neale, for providing the mechanical and engineering expertise to allow for our vehicles to be so reliable and proficient during the event. Belinda Cooke was inspirational in her solid training, preparation and fine-tuning of the young athletes. They spent two weeks in Nanjing to learn Mandarin and experience Chinese cultural first hand at our magnificent sister school, Jinling Primary.

Primary (population of over 3000 students over 2 campuses). In May, we had 60 students representing Laurimar Primary School at District Cross Country at Bundoora Park. We had a large number progress through to Division and 5 onto Regional Finals. Laila Cooke continued on to represent the Northern Metropolitan Region and LPS at the State Cross Country held at Bundoora park. Laila did us and herself so proud with a gallant performance in the wet conditions. Year 3 and 4 students are introduced to our sports program, with Year 3 students competing in their classes to become familiar with the process.

The Year 4 students are placed in teams and compete against one another each week in an intra school sport program with a ladder system and fixture being introduced.

The Prep students at LPS are very lucky to participate in our weekly PMP (Perceptual Motor Program) as very few schools run these programs. The PMP program concentrates on gross motor skills, perceptual and fundamental motor skills, such as balancing and integrates literacy and numeracy aligned with the Prep curriculum

We had our most successful year to date in Inter School Sports in 2018. The boys' Softball and girls' Volleyball teams both progressed to Regional finals.
