State of Emergency

As you would be all aware, throughout the weekend our State of Emergency in Victoria was extended through the July 22nd. This means that a number of our risk management factors and processes remain in place until further notice.

This includes,

- No parents or visitors entering on site.
- All authorised contractors at the discretion of the principal and undergo a health check

Continuation of <u>Staggered times for pick up and drop off</u> will remain in place. Please note that there is a complete 15 minute window of opportunity to drop off at each gate. If you have a year 1 entering the front gates at 9am, it is totally fine to take your time and walk around to the back north gates for your grade 3 drop off and arrive at say 9.10 for example.

The one change of time from day 1 of Term 3 will be our year 2's can enter their 3 gates from 8.45am through to 9am meaning that we no longer have any students entering from 9.15am.

These protocols will be reviewed for week 3 after the government have revised current restrictions. Our entire staff greatly appreciate and thank you for your co operation and understanding and your strong adherence to these protocols.

Principal's Report

Parking and safety etiquette at Drop off and Pick Up.

As we have arrived at more normality over the last 5 weeks, the increase in some very questionable decision making around parking etiquette and courtesy on the roads surrounding our school, has been noticeable.

I have shared below some feedback from a parent who has brought this to our attention.

I'm just writing in regards to the current parking situation in the mornings.

I know there are extra cars around the school at the moment at different times of the morning.

As I park at the Zen Garden parking bays, I see many parents pull up beside me and let their kids out on the road. Or park on the other side and let their kids run across the road.

Lots of people double park in Armidale Rd out the front of the main gates. It's extremely dangerous. I know we can't have someone police this in the mornings but maybe a mention in the next newsletter about parking and safety. It's crazy out there most mornings.

Please all reflect on this and if you need to adjust your behaviour please do so, to keep our community SAFE.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Laurimar Primary School is excited to be participating. A new application is being used this year that offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved

the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 4 September 2020.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.
