# Principal's Report

Our First 6 weeks of 2020 at LPS

It's fair to say that the commencement of 2020 has been as positive as it can be for our 1010 students considering the evolving developments of Corona Virus and the media headlines that it brings. We will continue to bring you the latest recommendations from the Health Department, Education Department and the Government. Rest assured that as a large school we have not had any diagnosed cases within our community. Constant vigilance around travel plans should be considered and in the event that you do travel to any highly affected countries over the upcoming break, communication with our school would be favourable.

Our students are to be commended on the strong focus they have displayed throughout the first 6 weeks, where they have set a strong platform for learning. Coming out of the bushfire season into unprecedented rain and wet and hot day timetables for our students, they have spent many hours inside rather than out. We are all very proud of their efforts to this point.

Our 140 plus Preps have simply been superb and it is a joy to walk through all 8 classrooms to witness a high level of engagement and a deep love of learning. Congratulations to our parents and teachers for all your hard work and preparedness.

We strongly encourage you to reinforce with your children and have discussions around our 3 school rules of;

- RESPECT our school
- Do Your BEST
- Help Others Succeed

As a family, it would be wonderful to have a positive conversation with your children around what success for them looks like in 2020 and through the remaining 3 weeks of the term. Please also ask them to articulate their goals for learning in terms of academic, sporting or social success.

### **Curriculum Day for PREPS**

On Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March, our Prep students will have a Curriculum Day to allow for further training for our Prep Team on the new Investigative Learning Model that has delivered such great success for our students. Prep students will not attend school on this day. To assist families with care for the day, we will run a vacation care service from 7am -6.30pm at a 50% reduction on our normal rates. # Principal's Report

### Respecting our Schools, Education and the Professional Staff in our Workplace

Around the same time each year, I like to communicate to the community around our expectations of parent conduct in schools and the challenges we face as educators. You would most probably be aware of the recent publicity around lack of respect for Police, Ambulance and Fire services and indeed the challenges for Education, our schools, Principals and their staff. Far too often there are strong media cases presented around these issues which involve people making unnecessary infiltrations without considering going through the correct process. There seems to be an increase in the number of occasions where our communities demonstrate a high level of disrespect to people within education, their schools and the teaching professionals that work within our schools. People need to be made aware that our school is a workplace and home to 125 plus employees (including our cleaning contractors after hours) and that all people need to be treated with a level of respect and dignity whilst at work. Our staff work tirelessly to ensure the students are safe when they attend school and we would love for this to be reciprocated.

Appropriate modes of face-to-face communication on a regular basis appear to be diminishing as people resort more and more to social media to express concerns. At Laurimar Primary School, we believe our amazing community is better than this and we ask that if there is an issue that needs to be discussed or addressed regarding our students, please refer to the appropriate channels of communication to work effectively to reach a solution that best supports your child and their learning needs. Evidently, the ratio of issues regarding academics or learning for students vs social issues is highly weighted in favour of the social demands. We have wonderful success in finding solutions when given the opportunity to work through with our brilliant families in a face to face conversation that involves a detailed plan around our students.

As a family, we would love for you to reflect on how we can be more effective in this space and feel free to discuss with your teachers or members of school leadership on ways of how we can all take our levels of respect to a much higher state.

There is certainly a need for us all to take stock and treat people the way that we would like to be treated with care, concern and compassion. Many thanks in advance for your consideration.

### **Emergency Evacuations**

As part of our OHS practices, we will be running a number of exercises as part of our emergency evacuation plan/ fire drill preparation as per our training and procedures. This will be the first of many for our staff and students and any visitors on the school grounds. Throughout the year, we will conduct fire drill evacuations, lockdown procedures and off site evacuations. Please discuss with your child the importance of these drills and remind them to remain calm in any drill event and listen to the instruction of their teacher. Safety of all at Laurimar Primary School is our priority and we will always work hard to maintain this culture.

### Police Visit Grade 1 and Prep

Students from Grade 1 and Prep were greeted today with a visit from our good friends the Police. The students were very excited to listen and ask questions . We are very grateful for their time.

### Supporting your child's Learning in the Home at LPS: Tips for building Literacy Skills

Being proactive and a strong role model to support your child's learning development is vital through the early years of schooling (Prep-6). Listening to your child read, reading to your child or listening and watching others read are all powerful ways to build capacity with literacy skills. One way to enhance your child's speaking and listening skills and to expand memory and imagination is through storytelling. Either you can tell the story, or encourage your child to tell the story.

### Storytelling might be about;

- Your child's favourite toy, holiday or sport
- Another member of the family
- Favourite pet or animal
- Favourite fictional character from a book or TV program
- A famous person/ sports person
- The work of people from different professions such as astronauts, scientists( STEM), firefighters, nurses,
   Police or teachers
- An imaginary world with imaginary characters
- An imaginary animal that can speak or come to life

When storytelling, make it exciting, with different voices, puppets or finger play.

Have a dress up box for your child to use for storytelling and imaginative play.

Start with what interests you and by creating the characters and setting.

Good luck and enjoy the magical journey of watching your child learn with your guidance and positive role modelling.

# **Assistant Principal's Report**

### Curriculum @LPS

### **Our Online Resources**

At Laurimar Primary School we subscribe to a variety of amazing online programs that can be used at home to support our students with their learning. We use Mathletics, Reading Eggs and Reading Eggspress, World Book Online, Sound Waves Online and Epic. Accessing these programs at home is easy using the passwords your child has been provided, by the their teacher. For Years 3 to 6 these should be in their school diary. **This is a great way to support and extend your child with their learning and strengthen the home school partnership.** Below is a summary of each program to give you an idea of what the program includes and the types of activities you could work on with your child at home.

### **MATHLETICS**

Mathletics as the name suggests is an online learning resource to support maths learning from Kindergarten in to Secondary School. It includes a full set of curriculum-aligned activities covering all topics and themes of maths covered throughout primary school and beyond. All activities are automatically marked, with learners receiving clear feedback on their progress. Mathletics Live provides learners with the opportunity to test their skills in a live online maths game, competing against others from right across the world! The Curriculum content is supported by interactive tutorials to both support students who need further explanation or practice of a concept or skill and it also explains concepts and skills not yet taught to those who would like to extend their learning.

### **READING EGGS AND EGGSPRESS**

ABC Reading Eggs and Reading Eggspress are designed to build children's skills in reading, comprehension, spelling, vocabulary, handwriting and grammar. The programs include activities for children from pre reading level to 13 years of age. Reading Eggs caters for Kindergarten to Year two and Reading Eggspress caters for Year 3 on. The online reading programs use simple navigation to allow direct access to all learning areas, and are computer, iPad and tablet friendly. Children can read books, complete activities and lessons, based on the books, compete against other students and earn rewards to improve their skills.

### **WORLD BOOK ONLINE**

World Book Online is a fantastic resource. It has a variety of different sections that the students can use to support their learning. World Book covers a vast number of subject areas and the text is at a level that students from as young as 7 years old can understand and read independently. It provides us with a strong reliable information source and it is a fun way to introduce computer research skills to students.

When you log on you can access Early World of Learning, Kids, Student, Timelines and eBooks by clicking on the tabs. In each of these sections there are a variety of resources such as books, news articles, activities, games and videos that the students can access to find out about the world around them.

### SOUND WAVES ONLINE

Sound Waves Spelling has an online component which supports the phonemes that we investigate across the school each week. There are many activities that you and your child can do together or that your child can do independently to further consolidate their spelling learning. Some of these activities are Sound boxes, chants and action clips, interactive games and words to learn that relate to the phoneme. See below for the Sound Waves phonemes we will be focusing on over the next two weeks.

# **Assistant Principal's Report**

### **EPIC**

Epic is another reading resource that students can access to enjoy, consolidate and improve their reading. It is a digital library for children 12 and under. This website has approximately 35,000 texts, audio books, quizzes, and learning videos. The items are categorized into topics so it is easy to navigate to find what you are looking for. Texts are levelled into age categories which make it easy to meet the needs of each child. At school this is a free resource however at home you need to create an account which incurs a cost of approximately \$8 a month.

We look forward to hearing about the activities children are engaging in at home with these fantastic resources.



## First Aid



### Medications

Please ensure you complete medication authority form if your child requires medications at school. This form can now be found on the school website. Please ensure a parent or guardian delivers the medication to First Aid and it is in its original packaging.

### **Spare Clothes**

Please put a spare change of clothes in your child's bag in case they are required.

### **Ventolin and Spacers**

If you child is an asthmatic, please provide a spare Ventolin and spacer to be stored in first aid.

### **Viral Gastroenteritis**

Viral gastroenteritis (gastro) is the one of the most common cause of vomiting and diarrhoea in young children. It is often a short-term illness, triggered by infection and inflammation of the digestive system, resulting in vomiting, diarrhoea and abdominal cramping.

### How is viral gastro spread?

\*Person to person – either directly or indirectly

This may be by direct contact with the infected person or by touching contaminated surfaces or by coming into contact with airborne droplets.

\*Eating contaminated food or drinking contaminated fluids

Infected people may continue to have the virus in their faeces and pass it onto others several days after symptoms have stopped. The Department of Health strongly suggests that people who have had gastro do not attend school until 48 hours after symptoms have stopped.

### How can I avoid the spread of viral gastro?

The simplest way to avoid spreading gastro is basic hand hygiene. This includes:

Washing your hands thoroughly with soap and warm water for at least 15 seconds before eating and after going to the toilet.


# Ride to School

# From the Office

Student Accident Insurance, Ambulance Cover Arrangements and Private Property brought to school.

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

### STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Parents are reminded that the school does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents/guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Reasonably low cost accident insurance policies are available from commercial insurers should you require one.



### **Immunisation Certificates**

All students are required by law to provide a copy of their certificate on enrolment. Even if your child is not immunised, you must still provide an immunisation status certificate. If you have previously received a letter requesting an immunisation certificate be provided to school, can you please follow this up promptly.

# From the Office

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS - CSEF PAYMENTS

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover part of the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$125 for primary school students

### **Change of Information**

If over the holiday period you have changed your address, telephone/mobile number or place of work details, could you please inform our office staff as soon as possible as we need to have Current information for emergency purposes. If your child attends before or after school care, ensure you let the OSHC Team know of any changes as well. Your assistance with this would be greatly appreciated.

### **Lost Clothing and Property**

Is your child/children's clothing labelled? Please check all clothing, hats, lunchboxes, etc. to make sure your child's name is clearly visible. If items are clearly labelled items can be returned to the correct owner. We appreciate the efforts in purchasing your child's uniform and the associated cost so it is imperative to be clearly labelled.


