### STEM @ Laurimar

# **Punctuality**

# Road Traffic Safety around the school

At the return of every school year, it is imperative that people adhere to all traffic rules, speeds and regulations around schools. Sadly, there have been multiple reports over the first 2 weeks from our crossing supervisors around road rage, disrespect, people not stopping when the supervisor is out with their sign and other forms of poor etiquette. Ironically at the end of last year, we put on a morning tea for our wonderful supervisors and they were talking so positively about the conduct and manners of 2018. When driving we may need to wait for very short periods of time occasionally just to keep a healthy balance and reduce the frustration. This needs to be taken into account during drop off and pick up times especially to keep everyone safe.

A reminder also that our <u>Kiss and Drop zone</u> at the east side of our school is strictly there to **DROP YOUR CHILD OFF SAFELY AND EXIT** within the time frame. Please do not park, leave your car and congest this area. Our staff who are on yard duty will ask you to leave if you are breaking the protocol within this Zone. When used effectively, this is such a positive zone to help traffic flow and get our students to and from school safely.

Please be vigilant with all areas of road safety around our school and others. I ask each and every one of you to use extreme cautions at drop off and pick up and respect the supervisors and teachers who try to safely manage these situations for all of our children.

# FEEDBACK @LPS



On Tuesday January 29 all staff were involved in a professional development day on feedback. Feedback especially from teacher to student is major area of focus at LPS for 2019. Research has found that Feedback which can be written or verbal, has a 0.73 effect size on student learning if done well. For feedback to have a high impact it needs to be timely, specific and clear, informing the student of their achievement based on the learning intention and what their next steps for further improvement are.

When asking your child about their learning or looking at their completed work, you will begin to see 3 symbols (picture on left) which are part of our feedback stamp that every teacher is starting to use. Discuss Feed Up, Feedback and Feed Forward with your child/ren so we can cement high quality feedback as a vital part of learning @LPS.

## **SCIENCE @LPS**

As previously mentioned our STEM Science Program has extended into Year 3. We are very proud of being able to have a one hour weekly Science lesson for years 3 to 6 at Laurimar Primary School as many primary schools are not able to offer this. The program for term one is:

Year 3 are focusing on Earth and Space Science (Earth, sun, moon, night and day)

Year 4 are focusing on Earth and Space Science (the Earth's surface and change)

Year 5 are focusing on Physical Science - Light

Year 6 are focusing on Earth and Space Science – Natural Disasters.

It promises to be an exciting term of learning for our young scientists!

# Assistant Principal's Report

# **SPELLING @ LPS**

Teachers have hit the ground running with Spelling. Spelling @LPS is based on the Sound Waves spelling approach which teaches students the 43 phonemes (sounds) in the English language and the variety of graphemes (letters) that make those sounds. We focus on the same phoneme each week from years 1 to 6 and in Prep we begin the year focusing on a different letter each day.

Research tells us that people need multiple exposures to phonemes and the different spelling choices they have to make these sounds and how they link to spell words, before the spelling of a word becomes automatic. The Sound Waves online activities are a great way to achieve this. Each student has a password in their diary to access the activities. As you click on each sound box you can learn the correct pronunciation of each phoneme sound, the variety of graphemes that make the phoneme sound, see words that have the phoneme sound, segment the words into their phoneme sounds and play a variety of games to develop and support this learning. As well as these activities there are worksheets that the students can complete to deepen the learning.

Fun activities such as these are a fabulous support for the work that is happening in our classrooms especially during holiday times.

## **PREP SOUND WAVES FOCUS**

Prep students will begin their Sound Waves journey next week where they will focus on a different letter each day.

### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS - CSEF PAYMENTS**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover part of the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$125 for primary school students

## **Change of Information**

If over the holiday period you have changed your address, telephone/mobile number or place of work details, could you please inform our office staff as soon as possible as we need to have Current information for emergency purposes. If your child attends before or after school care, ensure you let the OSHC Team know of any changes as well. Your assistance with this would be greatly appreciated.

# **Lost Clothing and Property**

If items are clearly labelled items can be returned to the correct owner. We appreciate the efforts in purchasing your child's uniform and the associated cost so it is imperative to be clearly labelled.

# Student Accident Insurance, Ambulance Cover Arrangements and Private Property brought to school.

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

# STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Parents are reminded that the school does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents/guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Reasonably low cost accident insurance policies are available from commercial insurers should you require one.

# **Immunisation Certificates**

All students are required by law to provide a copy of their certificate on enrolment. Even if your child is not immunised, you must still provide an immunisation status certificate. If you have previously received a letter requesting an immunisation certificate be provided to school, can you please follow this up promptly.

# Social Emotional Learning (SEL)

Welcome to 2019! How fabulous it is to be back at our amazing school for a fresh new year! It's exciting too, that this year class teachers in Years 3-6 will be responsible for teaching the You Can Do It! Education program in weekly SEL sessions. Welcome to Mrs Ash Sharp who continues her role in SEL this year, teaching YCDI! to Years Prep-2 alongside me, Marg Milne!

Firstly, this week all students will be learning about the concept of the Emotional Bank Account. This involves making positive deposits into our own emotional 'bank accounts' and the emotional 'bank accounts' of others. This concept is cleverly explained in a story that also provides a wonderful springboard into Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) for the year. It's called "Have You Filled a Bucket Today?...a guide to daily happiness for kids" written by Carol McCloud.

In this book we learn that we each carry around with us an invisible bucket.

Every child, every mum, every dad, every grandparent, every friend, every neighbour, EVERY PERSON carries an invisible bucket. This invisible bucket holds all your good thoughts and good feelings about yourself. You feel happy and good when your bucket is full and you feel sad and lonely when your bucket is empty.

As you can imagine it's great to have a *full* bucket and this is how it works...You need other people to fill your bucket and other people need you to fill theirs.

So, how do you fill a bucket? You fill a bucket when you say something kind to someone, when you do something kind for someone or even when you give someone a smile. When you make someone feel special, you are filling a bucket.

But, you can also dip into a person's bucket and take out some good feelings. You dip into a bucket when you make fun of someone, when you say or do mean things, or even when you ignore someone.

Now, here's the good news...when you fill someone's bucket, you fill your own bucket too! Because *you* feel good when you help *others* feel good!

So, why not decide to be a 'bucket filler' today and every day. It's fun and easy to do! It doesn't matter how young or old you are. It doesn't cost any money. It doesn't take much time. With practice you will become a great bucket filler! And remember, when you fill someone else's bucket, you fill your own bucket too.

Bucket filling makes EVERYONE feel good!

Why not have a conversation with the family about this wonderful story and talk about ways we can all be bucket fillers...at home, at work, at school!

That's all for now! Stay tuned for the next instalment as we share with you the students' progress through our research-based, quality SEL program...

# Canteen

### 2019 News from the Canteen!

With the start of the New Year comes the need to reset your child/ren's grade in Munch Monitor. Until you have done this you are unable to order and it will look like the canteen is closed through the Munch Monitor ordering page. Go to their profile and ensure that they are in the correct class. A current picture of your child/ren is also very helpful for canteen staff, this way we can quickly identify them, particularly new students.

If you are new to Laurimar Primary School our canteen operates 5 days a week for recess & lunch. When placing your child/ren's lunch order go to Munch Monitor website and place it by the 9:15am cut-off time. With recess orders the students need to come and collect these from us at the start of recess. If you order a frozen treat for your child/ren's lunch, they will get a stamp on their bag to come and collect it once the lunch time bell goes. The students must bring this bag to the canteen to collect their treat.

One of Munch Monitors functions is "Spending Money". This allows your child/ren to come to the canteen without the worry that they will misplace their change. You set their spending limit to daily/ weekly, then they simply come to the window, tell us their name and grade, then we complete the transaction on the computer.

The canteen is always looking for parent helpers, if you could spare an hour or two at some stage during the week, we would be very grateful. Duties could include baking biscuits, packing lunch tubs, restocking shelves and of course serving the students at recess & lunch times. It's great to see your own child/ren's faces light up when they see you in the canteen.







### First Aid

Welcome back for another school year!

At the beginning of each school year, we require a new Asthma Action Plan to be provided for all our students that have Asthma. Please come and see us in the First Aid Room for a blank Asthma Action Plan to take to your local doctor for completion. This is important as each child's needs are different and will advise us on the best way to provide medical assistance to your child.

We also ask that you provide your child's teacher with a clearly labelled reliever and spacer for their use within the classroom. Additional to this, we ask that if you haven't already, please provide to the First Aid Room a clearly labelled reliever and spacer for your child to use during recess and lunchtime.

# **Anaphylaxis**

Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and can be potentially life threatening. Laurimar Primary has numerous students with various food allergies that can result in anaphylaxis.

Any one of the below list of symptoms may be signs of Anaphylaxis:

- Difficult/ Noisy breathing
- Swelling of the tongue
- Swelling / tightness in throat
- Difficulty talking and / or hoarse voice
- Wheeze or persistent cough
- Persistent dizziness or collapse
- Pale and floppy (young children)

Classes that have a student with anaphylaxis are provided a letter at the beginning of the year requesting that they refrain from bringing in any food items that may trigger an anaphylactic response in the child at risk. In this way, we can continue to keep our students safe.


Two of the main purposes of our Anaphylaxis Policy is to:
